Duration of project: 2012 – 2017

Background:

Kupang government's mission is to create an efficient and effective urban spatial supported by good infrastructures and sustainable environment. The government developed clean water management and high quality neighborhood sanitation, and launched "Kupang Green and Clean" (KGC) program to achieve their goals. However the KGC program does not have big impacts on the community's behavioral changes. Through DELGOSEA, Kupang replicates the Eco Savers *Best Practice* from Marikina the Philippines, stressing on improving communities participation especially in raising awareness of elementary school children and communities in managing domestic solid waste. In implementing the activities, government involves stakeholders such as Kupang government staff, NGOs, local media, and housewives. Especially for housewives, activities will be focused on the recycle activities e.g. composting in their neighborhood.

Purpose of Concept/project: by the end of 2017 school children, government employees, and communities' awareness and participation in waste management and keeping the environment clean and healthy increased.

Key results:

- 3 schools on the first year plus 10 more schools until the fifth year are well implemented the program
- Communities able to do waste sorting and management
- Marketing network established to sell community's recycle products.
- All Kupang government offices implemented the weekly waste sorting program.

Main activities

The first activity is to draft the Waste Management Local Regulation as an umbrella of all activities, followed by the management of organic waste sorting and processing at the household level. A need assessment about the solid waste management will be carried out prior to that and activities' guidelines will be drafted after. The target is to strengthen community's institutions and to train them on how to do the waste sorting and management. In order to support community to sell their recycle products, a marketing network will be established.

The project will select 3 Elementary Schools on the first year as the pilot schools. An additional of 10 schools will be added on the second year until the fifth year in order to increase the participation of school children's, teachers, and parents in keeping the environment healthy. Awareness raising campaigns for the school management team (school directors, teachers, and school committees) also will be conducted as part of the waste management activities.

Especially for the government employees, several government offices will be selected as pilot offices to conduct the Clean Friday Program. The Working Group will do the monitoring and evaluation twice a year.
